

Teacher Profiles

NAWAL MOUDGIL (Music & Tabla)

Nawal Moudgil born in Firozpur, India completed his Double degree in Indian Classical Music & Tabla from Guru Nanak Dev University, Punjab in 1988 and Visharad (7 year course) in Indian Classical Music (Vocal and Tabla) from Pracheen Kala Kendra, Chandigarh

At the age of six, Nawal's father put him under the tutelage of a blind teacher Late Mr Mehar Chand Adhana for his initial training and thereafter he learned from Sardar Sukhpal Singh & Kanwal Jeet Singh who is presently the Head of Music at Punjabi University, in Punjab, India.

At the age of 12, he began his singing career with All India Radio, Jammu & Kashmir / Akashwani, Jalandhar, and Shrinagar Doordarshan, in singing Ghazals, Folk and Classical Music.

In July 1994, Nawal set up SIMDA and now it is the first full time North Indian Music School in Australia operating at four centres in Melbourne. At present SIMDA has over 100 students from all levels & ages between 6 to 86.

Nawal is a highly conscientious teacher satisfied with only the best, the student can offer. He combines traditional teaching methods with strict discipline, warmth and care, and modern observations, to tap the potential and talent of his students.

Nawal is ingenious in his ability to communicate across cultural, generational and gender barriers with refreshing originality in his music and tabla teaching and is admired for his boldness, creativity and depth of knowledge.

Today SIMDA has become the a centre of strong community involvement and a major meeting place where students of all ages not only learn Music, Dance and instruments but become aware of their cultural origins and heritage.

ANJU MOUDGIL (Kathak & folk dances)

An outstanding Kathak choreographer and teacher, Anju has trained many students and solidly prepared them to perform at various Indian Festivities & Concert events. A disciple of Smt Kiran Nanda and Ms Ranjana (Lucknow Gharana), Smt Shobha Koser (Jaipur Gharana), she has been teaching Kathak Dance in SIMDA for the last seven years.

Under the classical dances in India, KATHAK is the most ancient and popular style of dance. In ancient times Kathak was a kind of story telling. Storyteller, so called "KATHAKAR" have been wandering from place to place in the whole of India and told the stories about the greatness of gods. In addition it was also a spiritual discipline.

To start with Kathak at SIMDA, no basic knowledge is necessary. The education is according to the classical Indian tradition. But even to this high approach the learning can be enjoyed through the systematic teaching structure which is adapted to the western conditions. The interference of knowledge is experienced by the students as enjoyable and easy.

Regular practice of Kathak may release blocked energies which helps to coordinate body and mind in its functions. It's an adventure in the fascinating world of a foreign country and discovers hidden corners of the personal being. Dance is a means, which is able to open doors to more joy and liveliness.
